

Job Description:

The assistant senior patrol leader is the second highest ranking junior leader in the troop. He is appointed by the senior patrol leader with the approval of the Scoutmaster. The assistant senior patrol leader acts as the senior patrol leader in the absence of the senior patrol leader or when called upon. He also provides leadership to other junior leaders in the troop.

Assistant senior patrol leader duties:

1. Helps the senior patrol leader lead meetings and activities.
2. Runs the troop in the absence of the senior patrol leader.
3. Helps train and supervise the troop scribe, quartermaster, instructors, librarian, historian and chaplain aide.
4. Serves as a member of the patrol leaders' council.
5. Sets a good example
6. Enthusiastically wears the Scout uniform correctly
7. Lives by the Scout Oath, Law and Motto.
8. Shows Scout spirit.

Qualifications:

1. Advanced to the rank of Star or higher.
2. Been elected and served actively as Patrol Leader or Assistant Patrol Leader for a period of no less than 6 months.
3. Been elected to position of ASPL by majority vote.
4. Expected to attend Junior Leader Training.
5. Been registered member of BSA for at least 1 year.
6. Been a registered member of Troop 1104 for at least 6 months.
7. Received approval of the Scoutmaster.
8. Be present at 85% of Troop meetings, PLC meetings, and outings.
